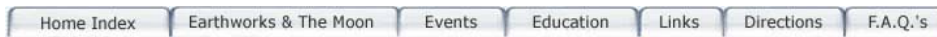

"This 80-page book introduces elementary and middle school readers to Wisconsin peoples—ancient and recent—and explains how examining the bits and pieces they left behind gives us clues as to the way they lived. The book is divided into eight chapters, and begins with a description of Wisconsin's first inhabitants: Paleo-Indians, Archaic Indians, and Woodland Indians. Subsequent chapters take the reader from early Indian cultures to those of the Europeans and Euro-Americans, with discussion of fur trading, lead mining, logging, and farming. The last chapter focuses on stewardship, showing that we can all play a part in taking care of our past.

Kid-friendly in format, with lively and charming original illustrations of badgers-as-archaeologists, the book is packed with drawings, photographs, and informational side bars that expand on concepts introduced in the text."
